WHEREAS: The Gullah/Geechee Nation consists of a group of people ranging

from Jacksonville, North Carolina to Jacksonville, Florida; and

WHEREAS: Originating from contact between enslaved people of African

descent and the people indigenous to the Southern United States' Low Country, Gullah/Geechee people developed a unique Gullah language and culture. Descendants reside throughout the Southeastern Low Country, on all the Sea Islands, and thirty-five

miles inland of the St. Johns River; and

**WHEREAS:** Jacksonville is proud to be home to the largest population of

Gullah/Geechee people in the Southeast, and serves as a focal point

for the celebration of Gullah/Geechee arts and culture; and

WHEREAS: The Jacksonville Gullah Geechee Nation Community Development

Corporation (JGGNCDC) serves to connect, preserve, and celebrate the history and culture of the Gullah/Geechee people here in

Jacksonville; and

**WHEREAS:** The Jacksonville Gullah Geechee Nation CDC continues to host an

annual October Gullah Fest, celebrating the heritage of

Gullah/Geechee people throughout Northeast Florida; and

WHEREAS: The City of Jacksonville recognizes and honors the impact of

Gullah/Geechee culture and heritage in the community and the

region.
