WHEREAS: Since 1983, April has been designated Child Abuse Prevention Month

in the United States; and

WHEREAS: Children are often the targets of neglect, mental, physical, and sexual

abuse, which occurs mainly within their household and can oftentimes

lead to filicide; and

WHEREAS: There are approximately 500 filicide cases that occur in the U.S.

annually; and

WHEREAS: Community-wide efforts have proven to be essential at preventing

and safeguarding our children and their futures by providing loving and nurturing relationships and environments in which they can excel

and thrive; and

WHEREAS: Every Floridian is designated a mandatory reporter and is expected to

abide by the "if you see something, say something" motto. The Florida Abuse Hotline accepts reports of known or suspected child abuse, neglect, or abandonment, as well as reports of known or suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation of a vulnerable adult at 1-

800-962-2873 24 hours a day and seven days a week; and

WHEREAS: Jacksonville and its residents have the responsibility to pioneer the

way forward in the fight to acknowledge this problem and face it head on, allowing the community to take back the narrative of this city and further the voice and impact of the filicide awareness community.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim April 9-15, 2023 as

FILICIDE AWARENESS WEEK

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to raise awareness of filicide, become familiar with the warning signs and support the efforts within our community to assist in the prevention of another child's death due to child abuse at the hand of a parent or caregiver.
