WHEREAS:

For generations, people of Asian and Pacific Islander descent have played a significant role in virtually every sector of American life. Some are on the forefront of scientific advancement and information technology. Others are members of our brave Armed Forces and have fought for the freedoms we enjoy; and

WHEREAS:

In 1992, the month of May was officially designated as Asian-Pacific American Heritage Month to recognize the many Americans of Asian and Pacific Islander descent who contribute to the economic, political, intellectual, and cultural diversity of our nation. The month of May was chosen to commemorate the immigration of the first Japanese to the United States on May 7, 1843, and to mark the anniversary of the completion of the transcontinental railroad on May 10, 1869, whose work was led by Chinese immigrants; and

WHEREAS:

The Mayor's Asian-American Advisory Board (MAAAB) has observed Asian-American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month in Jacksonville for more than a decade, joining others across the nation in recognizing the valuable contributions of these citizens and communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim May 2023 as

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to commemorate, celebrate, and raise awareness of the contributions and history of the Asian American experience in the United States.
