Michael Shell commented that items g and h on the consent agenda are confusing at first glance, because the column, 'Bi-Weekly Distribution Amount' sounds like this is the amount of the members' individual bi-weekly DROP payments. He asked Steve Lundy to explain.

Steve Lundy said that the new appearance of the items on the consent agenda is due from it being pulled from a new ITD report, which shows all new benefits in the month. The 'Bi-Weekly Distribution Amount' column is the amount of each member's total DROP ending balance chosen to amortize over X-amount of bi-weekly payout periods. For example, if Daniel Hurley chose to take \$1,000 of his DROP ending balance as a lump sum, and amortize the remainder, he would have a 'Total DROP' amount of \$2,514.61, a 'Refund Amount' of \$1,000.00, a 'Rollover Amount' of \$0.00, and a 'Bi-Weekly Distribution Amount' or \$1,514.61. These same amounts were shown on previous Advisory Committee agendas, but arranged and worded differently. The wording shown here comes directly from the JaxPension system. He said the table's columns could be re-worded to be less confusing.

Michael Pelletier asked if another column could be added to show the bi-weekly payments made to the member from their DROP accounts.

Steve Lundy said that could easily be added to the agendas. He said he would also re-word the column to make it less confusing.

Thomas Lumpkin made a motion to approve items a-d and to receive items e-h as information. Seconded by Jean Paravisini. The vote passed unanimously.

IV. Executive Director's Report

James Holderfield said he was glad to see Timothy Johnson present today.

Timothy Johnson said that he hopes to have the PFPF 'back in the saddle' next week for a 'soft' reopening. Two other staff are out sick with COVID-19. We are observing the protocol of quarantining for 14 days, and getting a negative test result before returning to the office. Two-thirds of the PFPF staff should return Monday. The PFPF Office will be closed to walk-ins, but scheduled appointments will be honored.

Timothy Johnson thanked the Advisory Committee for all of the well wishes during his own illness with COVID-19.

Timothy Johnson said that regarding the Weathington Disability Hearing, there will be a joint Advisory Committee – Board of Trustees meeting scheduled for September 18. Steve Lundy will send the meeting notices. He will also send via encrypted email the updated disability file, once received back from the PFPF Medical Director.

V. Counsel Reports

Lawsikia Hodges said there is nothing to report, other than that OGC is looking at disability hearings, and how to streamline the process. There has been a lot of ping-pong back and forth, and we have learned lessons from this case. We will streamline the process so it will be smoother next time.
