The New Jersey Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Council (NJ BPAC) is coordinated by the Alan M. Voorhees Transportation Center on behalf of the New Jersey Department of Transportation. The core mission of NJ BPAC is to advise, coordinate, and collaborate with NJDOT and other state, regional, and local agencies and organizations on policies, programs, initiatives, and best practices that advance walking, bicycling, transit, and micromobility as safe and essential forms of transportation and recreation for people of all ages and abilities, with a focus on meeting equity, safety, public health, and resiliency goals. NJ BPAC advises on the implementation of the New Jersey Bicycle & Pedestrian Master Plan, serving as both a resource and key stakeholder in existing and future statewide transportation planning efforts, such as the implementation of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Emphasis Area of the Strategic Highway Safety Plan. NJ BPAC is also a forum for information exchange, engagement, and coordination among experts and entities across the state, providing opportunities for resource-sharing and education on emerging issues, including access to experts in the field of bicycle and pedestrian safety, education, and design.

Complete Streets Policy

What policies are in place now?

- Context Sensitive Streets Policy stated in 2030 Comprehensive Plan and 2030 Mobility Plan
- Context Sensitive Streets Standards Committee (2013) within Public Works

Goal: "To permit, design, operate, and maintain Jacksonville's streets to promote safe and convenient access and convenient access and travel for all users..."

Purpose: Incorporate context sensitive design principals into the LDPM, LDRs, and all other plans, manuals, programs, etc.






Extended closure in Main Street Bridge's future | Jax Daily Record jaxdailyrecord.com • 2 min read

- The Florida Department of Transportation announced a trunnion replacement project is set to take place in late 2027 to early 2028.
- Trunnion bearings act as an axle at the top of the bridge to support its weight and they allow the bridge to be raised and lowered.
- The trunnion is the last original piece of machinery to be rehabilitated on the bridge, which was built in 1941.
- FDOT said the project is going to cost an estimated \$108 million.
- 13,800 AADT





Main St Bridge Lane Reduction Study


