many successful pro bono efforts; and

WHEREAS: This year's theme of the celebration is "Law in Everyday Life." The American

Bar Association encourages local and state Bars to raise awareness of how law affects all aspects of life for low-income or other marginalized

individuals; and

WHEREAS: Northeast Florida is home to a diverse and vibrant legal community. The

Jacksonville Bar and Fourth Circuit Pro Bono Committee continue to support

pro bono efforts for those in need in our community.
