WHEREAS: There are over 200,000 individuals in Florida living with Vitiligo;

and

WHEREAS: While vitiligo is not contagious and usually not physically painful,

the psychological and social effects are well-documented and

especially devastating to children; and

WHEREAS: In 2022 the FDA approved the first ever drug approved to treat

vitiligo; and

WHEREAS: First celebrated in 2011, the United Nations annually recognizes

June 25 as World Vitiligo Day; and

WHEREAS: Beautifully Unblemished Vitiligo Support Group, Inc. was founded

in 2018 to bring together those with vitiligo to help educate,

support, advocate, and spread awareness.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim June 2023 as

VITILIGO AWARENESS MONTH

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to raise awareness of Vitiligo and support the efforts being made in the community to assist those living with Vitiligo.
