Mayor Ed Austin and have been supported by every mayor since. CPACs were created to strengthen Jacksonville's neighborhoods and support the unique

needs of each district's citizens; and

**WHEREAS:** In a city government of the people, by the people, and for the people, CPACs

engage citizens in the civics process by offering an open line of communication between residents, businesses, neighborhoods, community organizations,

education institutions, and government officials; and

WHEREAS: The six districts represent more than 200 neighborhoods and every inch of

Jacksonville's 840 square miles – the Urban Core District, the Greater Arlington/Beaches District, the Southeast District, the Southwest District, the Northwest District, and the North District. CPAC meetings are open to the public

and voting members are appointed through a nomination process; and

**WHEREAS:** Broad-based public involvement in infrastructure; public health; economic

development; public safety; planning; land use; zoning; transportation; community services; parks and recreation; arts and culture; and schools

contributes to the well-being of all Jacksonville citizens; and

WHEREAS: No individuals or groups are better qualified than community residents and

advocates to work to identify issues, suggest solutions and develop programs needed to solve existing and future challenges in the neighborhoods where they

live, work, and play; and
