

PROCLAMATION

ONE CITY. ONE JACKSONVILLE.

WHEREAS: The Cathedral Arts Project (CAP) was founded in Jacksonville in 1993

by a group of volunteers who believed that regardless of age or circumstance, every child should have access to a quality arts

education; and

WHEREAS: The arts and humanities are particularly important for children. Studies

show that arts learning improves cognitive development in children, including verbal communication, attention skills and memory retrieval,

all of which help children succeed in other areas; and

WHEREAS: Children in the arts are five time more likely to stay in school than their

peers, and for every \$1 spent on afterschool arts education, cities save \$9 on reduced welfare and crime costs, improved academic performance, and increased future earning potential of children; and

WHEREAS: Americans for the Arts has shown that a high concentration of arts in a

city increases civic engagement, improves child welfare, and lowers

crime and poverty rates; and

WHEREAS: Today, CAP's vision is for Northeast Florida to lead the nation in

providing essential and accessible arts education that recognizes,

grows, and amplifies every child's unique skills and strengths.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim October 2021 as

NATIONAL ARTS AND HUMANITIES MONTH

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to support local arts and humanities by donating, volunteering, participating, and sharing details about arts programs within their communities.
