WHEREAS: Wolfson Children's Hospital and it's partners, including the UF First

Coast Child Protection Team and Nemours have been treating children who have been physically and sexually abused as well as those who

have suffered from child neglect, for decades; and

WHEREAS: Child abuse prevention programs were developed upon the belief that

children can be safely protected and cared for within their own homes

when parents are provided services and resources for support; and

WHEREAS: Every Floridian is a mandatory reporter. If you see something, say

something. The Florida Abuse Hotline accepts reports 24 hours a day and seven days a week of known or suspected child abuse, neglect, or abandonment, as well as reports of known or suspected abuse,

neglect, or exploitation of a vulnerable adult at 1-800-962-2873.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim April 2020 as

CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION MONTH
