WHEREAS: Sexual Assault Awareness Month raises awareness of year-round efforts

that call attention to the prevalence of sexual violence and its widespread impacts, while educating communities on how to prevent it;

and

WHEREAS: No one community is immune to sexual assault, and members across

race, gender, and class can experience sexual assault; and

WHEREAS: However, statistics show some individuals are more likely to be subject

to sexual harassment, assault, and abuse than others; and

WHEREAS: More than 1 in 4 Black women, 1 in 3 Hispanic women, and 4 in 5 Native

American women experience sexual assault in their lifetime; and

WHEREAS: Individuals who lack systemic supports, like those living with intellectual

disabilities, also experience higher instances of sexual violence; and

WHEREAS: The theme of this year's Sexual Assault Awareness Month campaign in

Duval County is "Drawing Connections: Prevention Demands Equity." This theme spotlights how certain groups of people are at higher risk for sexual violence, and those same people are also the most impacted by

inequitable systems and oppression in our society; and

WHEREAS: This theme calls on all individuals, communities, organizations, and

institutions to change ourselves and the systems surrounding us to build

equity and respect; and

WHEREAS: Preventing sexual violence is the ultimate goal and is everyone's

responsibility. Drawing Connections recognizes that ending all forms of

oppression will end sexual harassment, assault, and abuse.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim April 2023 as

SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH

in Jacksonville and encourage all citizens to take action to prevent sexual violence and create change for the future.
