was home to more than 30 film movie studios; and

WHEREAS: Founded in 2001, the 48 Hour Film Project is an international film

competition. In 2007, it expanded into Jacksonville with the JAX 48

Hour Film Project; and

WHEREAS: Winning films from each of the competition's 120 cities go on to be

screened at national and international festivals, culminating in a

chance to be screened at the Cannes Film Festival in France; and

WHEREAS: In 2023, the film "Threshold" won best short film in Jacksonville. In

March 2023, "Threshold" won the grand champion prize at the Filmapalooza in Los Angeles, California. This Jacksonville-created film

will be screened at the Cannes Film Festival in May 2023; and

WHEREAS: As Jacksonville continues to grow its artistic scene, projects like the

Jax 48 Hour Film Project and the annual LOL Jax Film Festival – led by Adam and Monique Madrid – and talented film crews like those who produced "Threshold" are highlighting Jacksonville on the international

stage; and

WHEREAS: Jacksonville is proud of its long history in film production and the

wealth of talented individuals and organizations working to put a

spotlight on the arts and film scene in Jacksonville.
