WHEREAS: Libraries contribute to the intellectual growth of children and teens during the

summer through reading programs; and

WHEREAS: Two-thirds of the reading achievement gap between high- and low-

socioeconomic status ninth graders can be explained by unequal access to summer learning opportunities, and one-third of the gap is present before

students begin school; and

WHEREAS: More than 60% of America's low-income children are growing up in homes

without age-appropriate books or reading materials, leaving them an average

of three years behind children raised in homes with many books; and

WHEREAS: Research has shown just 20 minutes a day of reading or being read to can

provide time for parents and caregivers to bond with children, expose children to as many 1.8 million words per year, help students reach the 90th percentile on standardized tests, improve listening skills, prepare pre-kindergartners for school, improve children's earning potential later in life,

and lead to healthier lives; and

WHEREAS: Adults who read regularly and use their public library are role models for

children, motivating them to become lifelong readers and learners; and

WHEREAS: Public libraries supplement access to reading materials with fun and enriching

events and activities that are free and open to all citizens in their service

area; and

WHEREAS: Jacksonville Public Library encourages a love of reading by providing access

to books both in libraries and giving children books during the summer to build their home libraries. By visiting the library frequently, these young library users will grow their chance of becoming lifelong learners and readers.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LENNY CURRY, by virtue of the authority vested in me as mayor of Jacksonville, Florida, do hereby proclaim June 2023 as

SUMMER LEARNING AT THE LIBRARY

in Jacksonville and encourage all parents and caregivers to visit the library with their children so those children can read and borrow books, read or be read to for at least 20 minutes per day, participate in enriching summer learning activities, and receive free books to build their home libraries.
